Trees for Life is an award-winning Scottish conservation volunteering charity working to restore the ancient Caledonian Forest to a spectacular wilderness region of the Scottish Highlands. Most of our work is carried out by volunteers.

The Caledonian Forest once covered much of the Highlands and was home to many rare and endangered species. Today, only scattered fragments remain, and overgrazing prevents the growth of new trees. Urgent action is required to conserve the forest and its unique wildlife for the future.

Conservation Volunteering

From planting trees to removing non-native species, erecting fences, collecting seeds and berries, and growing trees in our nursery, there is something for everyone!

FCS Glen Affric

Often described as the most beautiful glen in Scotland with ancient woodland and dramatic mountains. Based at our newly restored Athnamulloch Bothy.

RSPB Corrimony

Torridon



This picturesque reserve is home to many rare birds including black grouse, crested tits, Scottish crossbills and golden eagles.



Dundreggan Tree Nursery

Our tree nursery at Dundreggan is situated amongst beautiful ancient woodlands. Help grow rare trees such as dwarf birch and trial innovative ways to propagate aspen.

Rewilding Dundreggan

Our Conservation Estate near Loch Ness is our flagship forest restoration project and a centre for rewilding. These weeks at

Dundreggan combine practical activities such as tree planting to restore forests and wildlife habitats and learning about missing species such as lynx and beaver. Throughout these weeks there are rewarding opportunities to observe wildlife including pine marten and wild boar, learn how to use camera traps and much more!

Ways to Volunteer

Conservation Weeks

A combination of exciting wildlife experiences and practical conservation work. Choose from various beautiful locations in the Highlands to spend a week with us restoring the Caledonian Forest. Full accommodation, food, transport and training is included.

Conservation Days

Our Conservation Days are for people who live locally in the Inverness-shire, mid-Highland or West Moray area. Activities include tree planting, surveying natural regeneration, rhododendron bashing, collecting seeds and berries, working in our tree nursery and much more!

Long-Term Volunteer placements

If you are hoping to start a career in conservation or simply want to expand your skill set, our Long-Term Volunteer programme is the ideal way to gain experience in practical forest restoration work. Placements are from one to three months at our Dundreggan Conservation Estate.

Join our Conservation Weeks

There are up to ten volunteers on our Conservation Weeks, with two skilled and experienced focalisers (group leaders). We provide accommodation in a bothy, lodge or holiday cottage, all meals and transport to and from Inverness. Days run from 9am – 5pm, with a day off midweek to do something with the group or explore the local area. Vegetarian meals are cooked on a voluntary rota basis and evenings are free to enjoy the beautiful Highland surroundings.
