Events & ceilidh fundraisers

A Bristol-based collective held a wonderfully named 'Caper-Ceilidh' event and raised over £400 for rewilding.

"As a collective, we're aiming to raise as much money as possible to support organisations working to restore the natural world around the UK, particularly groups which support and involve local communities. One of our organisers - Lucie - had recently returned from a week with Trees for Life in Glen Affric and was really impressed by how much Trees for Life has already achieved, their future aims, and the positive impact Trees for Life has on many people's lives."





Grove fundraisers

The HT550 has been renowned as the U.K.'s hardest bike packing route, navigating through the wild and remote landscapes of the Scottish Highlands. The riders of the Highland Trail 550 (HT550) raised an impressive £7,000 for rewilding.

Rather than paying an entry fee, participants donated trees to the HT550 grove, helping to restore the Caledonian forest. The route passes close to the Dundreggan Rewilding Centre and through Glen Affric, making it deeply intertwined with the landscapes Trees for Life works to restore.

Art fundraisers

Artist Jack Spowart auctioned one of his original artworks, raising £80 for rewilding.

The artwork auctioned was titled 'an giuthas mu dheireadh' meaning 'the last pine' in Gaelic. The line drawing represents Scotland's hope for a rewilded future.

Walk fundraisers

Neil Diment completed his epic Lands End to John'Groats walk and raised nearly £2,000 in support of rewilding. Neil's 1,400-mile journey took him all the way to Dundreggan, which is not far from the Great Glen Way section of the trail, before heading north to Caithness and Sutherland.





Garden fundraisers

Nature-friendly gardener Heather Lansdell opened the gates to her cottage garden 'Sunflower Dreams' in the Highland seaside town of Nairn as part of Scotland's Garden Scheme. The scheme gives people the chance to visit private gardens while raising funds for good causes. 130 people visited Heather's colourful garden in one day, raising £500 for rewilding.

Business fundraisers

Abbie Lois is an illustrator based in Glasgow. Inspired by folklore and nature, Abbie donated a percentage of her sales to support rewilding.

"I grew on the fringes of the Highlands, and it breaks my heart hearing how different the land is now compared to when my parents and grandparents were children. I want to be a part of a movement that ensures we do as much as we can to protect and enrich our wild spaces before it's too late."
