Dundreggan and the Rewilding Centre

Dundreggan is our 10,000-acre estate in Glenmoriston between Loch Ness and Skye. Since 2008, the estate has been transformed by Trees for Life and its volunteers into one of the best examples of forest restoration in Scotland. It includes a ground-breaking tree nursery and is where many volunteers come to take part in rewilding projects.

The Rewilding Centre opened in April 2023 and serves as a gateway to make Dundreggan, and the work being done here, making rewilding more accessible to a broader audience. It operates under the Enterprises arm of Trees for Life and is a commercial business.

The site includes an innovative visitor centre, a café, 40-bed accommodation, events and educational facilities. The Rewilding Centre welcomes visitors of all ages, interests and backgrounds to explore the natural, Gaelic and cultural heritage of the Highlands and be inspired by rewilding initiatives, including the restoration of the Caledonian forest.

Overall purpose of the job

To provide high-quality administrative, data and relationship-management support to the Fundraising team so that Trees for Life can provide outstanding stewardship to our donors. This role will help grow unrestricted and project income from corporate partners, trusts and foundations and major donors. The post-holder will help ensure that fundraising activity and reporting is well supported, insight-led and financially robust, acting as a vital link between frontline conservation teams, finance, and fundraising.

Key liaisons

This post will work closely with the Senior Fundraising Manager, our Fundraising Partnership Managers, the Head of Fundraising and Marketing, the Trees for Life finance team and our operational field teams.

Key responsibilities

- Maintain and update fundraising data in our CRM (Beacon) with 100% accuracy, producing regular reports for the fundraising and management teams.
- Co-ordinate the proposal and reporting timetable across corporates, trusts & foundations and major donors, ensuring all deadlines, acknowledgements and stewardship actions are met.
- Prepare first-draft funding proposals that demonstrate importance, outcomes, timelines
 and costs of rewilding initiatives, drawing on information supplied by SMT, field teams and
 the finance department.
- Prepare first-draft impact reports for funders that highlight the progress and impact of that has been enabled by donor support.
- Help track income, pledges and expenditure against project budgets; raise purchase orders and code invoices correctly – building coherence between our finance and CRM systems.
- Support cultivation and stewardship events, including compiling guest lists, sending invitations, managing RSVPs and producing briefing packs.
- Draft and send timely, personalised thank-you letters, certificates and updates to supporters.
- Research prospective funders and corporate partners, compiling concise briefing notes.
- Serve as the day-to-day contact for corporate partners giving £1-5k annually, and workplace-giving champions, providing materials and updates.



- Champion best practice in data protection, Gift Aid and fundraising regulation, flagging any risks or compliance issues.
- Contribute ideas for improving systems, processes and supporter journeys, and take the lead on agreed mini-projects (e.g. refreshing the corporate welcome pack).

Person specification

The successful candidate for the role will be:

- Passionate about nature restoration and the mission of Trees for Life.
- Methodical, organised and able to juggle multiple deadlines without losing detail.
- A team player who enjoys collaborating with a wide range of colleagues and supporters.
- Comfortable working with figures, budgets and large data sets.
- Proactive and willing to take ownership of tasks, seeing them through to completion.

Knowledge and experience

Essential:

- At least one year's paid experience in a fundraising, grant-making or sales support role.
- Working knowledge of a CRM database.
- Proven track record of producing clear written material such as proposals, reports or marketing copy.
- Experience of financial administration: coding invoices, reconciling income, basic budget monitoring.

Desirable:

- Experience of supporting relationships with corporates, trusts/foundations or high-networth individuals
- Knowledge of fundraising regulation, GDPR and Gift Aid rules
- Understanding of conservation, rewilding or environmental grant funding
- Event support experience (virtual or in-person)

- Positive, can-do attitude and a willingness to learn
- Discreet and empathetic, able to handle confidential information sensitively
- Resilient under pressure and adaptable to changing priorities
- Excellent interpersonal skills warm, professional and persuasive
